Over the last three months, we have shared Zoom lectures with Head Office on Catholic Social Teachings; Rosary Recitals and Council meetings at various venues. We have had a phenomenally successful Seminar for our Grand Knights and Deputy Grand Knights, which was well received, and I hope will trigger some enthusiasm in the Councils. There are follow-up hard copies available on request. There will be other Training Seminars about Finance and Administration, Membership and

Membership Statistics

In July we were asked to survey all the Councils in our Province to ascertain correct figures of membership. The purpose of this survey was to have the correct figures in Head Office in order that invoices, when sent out to Councils were correct and to have an understanding of the actual membership and structure of the Order.

Thank you to all GK's for submitting the figures on time which allowed us to make the final return to Head Office by the date requested.

The survey showed the current membership of Province 30 is:-

Golden Jubilarians 16
Brothers over 75 46
Other Brothers 92
Total 154

This compares to a membership of 168 at 1st April 2019. The difference is made up from deaths and lapsations, the survey did not show details of new brothers joining in this period.

Brothers, death come to all of us and is largely beyond our control, lapsations/resignations, however, are controllable if we are looking after our Brothers and querying their reasons for lapsing/resigning. Membership Officers, Welfare Officers, stay alert and be mindful of Brothers who may be thinking of leaving the Order, sometimes a quiet word at the right time can turnaround a decision of this kind.

Brother Paul Turnbull RIP

(May11th 1937 – 29th June 2020) A member of Sudbury Council 267

Paul passed away peacefully at St. Luke's Hospice, Kenton on 29th June 2020. His wife, Rosemary, and two sons, Paul and Laurence, were able to be with him during his last 36 hours, which was a great comfort to them. His sister Mary was also able to see him during this period.



Paul was born in Bishop Auckland Hospital, County Durham, on May 11th 1937. He was born the day before the Coronation of George VI and Queen Elizabeth so he, like the other babies born that day, was given a commemorative silver spoon to mark the occasion. He lived in Middlesbrough until the family home was bombed in 1940 and he moved to his grandparents' home in Formby, Liverpool along with his mother and two siblings. His father was in the RAF and after various moves of location was stationed in Wrexham where the family eventually settled. After attending the Catholic School in Wrexham and working for 3 years at Border Breweries he began his National Service in the Royal Army Service Corps. He completed an extra year on top of the mandatory 2 and remained a member of the army reserve whilst working.

Paul met his wife, Rosemary, at St. Mary's Youth Club in Wrexham. Rosemary was staying in Wrexham at the time with her cousin. They married on June 6th 1960 and this year, although Paul was seriously ill, they celebrated their Diamond Wedding Anniversary together. After a brief period living in Wrexham they moved to London, living firstly in Fulham and then in the Greenford and Sudbury areas. Eventually they moved to a house next door to St. George's Church in Sudbury. They had two sons, Paul and Laurence, and five grandchildren. Paul lived for his family and both he and Rosemary had a great relationship with the whole family.

He worked for various companies until taking retirement at the age of 62. He was always a very active person. He was the Treasurer of Sudbury Court Youth FC and then Kilburn Hawks Youth FC. He was involved with St. George's School and became a Governor there. He was a keen golfer and a member of Sudbury Golf Club and Harrow School Golf Club. He was a sports fan and staunch supporter of Newcastle FC. He also loved to

travel and enjoyed many overseas trips as well as time in Great Yarmouth.

Paul was a very committed Catholic. In his youth he was an altar server. At St. George's Church he was very active. He joined the Knights of St. Columba in 1967 and was the Grand Knight from 1993 to 1995. He was always fully involved and was the Membership Officer up to the time when he went into hospital in November 2019. He was a Eucharistic Minister and went to Lourdes on many occasions, helping others. Paul and Rosemary hosted many fund raising coffee mornings in their house. He joined the Catenians Association in 1991 and was a loyal member through to his final illness.


Following an operation in November 2019 Paul was in Northwick Park Hospital until late May, when he was transferred to St. Luke's Hospice. During his time in hospital he contracted Covid-19, but was later given an all clear test. For some two months he was in isolation and could only communicate with his family by mobile phone. The family were grateful for the opportunity to visit him in St. Luke's.

In a tribute to him from his sons, Paul and Laurence, they said that he will be remembered as a humble, kind, caring and gentle man. ®









During this COVID-19 pandemic I have both seen and heard of all the great work in local communities that is happening. In built up areas, where people tend not to call on their neighbours or indeed know them, we now see whole streets coming together to help each other.

So let us again look to the future with a positive thought in the words used in the Easter message of Pope Francis:

Getting to know our Councils better. from Bro Tony Berkeley DPGK Province 30

Since the last issue, Brothers and Province have been very busy trying to get to know Councils and their membership better. We started doing this by an **Action & Youth Survey.**

The Questions may have been a little out of the norm, but they are questions we all keep asking at most of our meetings. Launching the survey, we aimed to get an answer from across all the Councils, so to help us see the bigger picture of where we need to focus our improvement effort.

As with any communications exercise, one needed to update the Province's records of what contact details we hold. The Address book was very useful in doing this, but there is a need to hold more details than what it currently shows. For example, who has a **Smart phone**, so we can have text messages and **FACETIME** contact, and which brothers have **ZOOM** access?

I also realised that I may well be able to contact the Officers of each Council, but we do have brothers whose details are not shown on the address book as they don't hold office. Something I need to discuss with Bro Michael Bagness to explore future recording.

After having updated my contact lists, I then sent out the first Survey – headed as **ACTION & YOUTH REVIEW**. It was not easy to get the replies flowing in, and it required two or three repeated emails, and eventually a number of phone calls, but as a first try, I managed to get 10/12 points. Council 295 Harrow & District and Council 963 Yeading did not make the finishing line this time.

The biggest problem I encountered was that some do not read their emails at all, some not very regularly, and there were two brothers whose recorded telephone details do not work. The replies have been analysed and will be discussed at the next Provincial Officers meeting to help us put together a program of improvements where necessary. One other important lesson for me was that the way the questionnaire was designed did not always meet the facilities brothers had to be able to return a completed form, but where there is a will there is a way, and most of the difficulties where ironed out. I thank all the Grand Knights and brothers for oiling the wheels on occasion.

Learning from the above survey, the next questionnaire was designed to enable brothers to just

tick-the-box and submit the completed form without having to photo-copy, or scan or even take a photo of the completed form. This time the returns were through the

Provincial Website. All that was needed was to click the link, the questions showed up, and all one had to do was to put a tick against the



questions. The scope of this 'THE KNIGHTS & THEIR PARISH', was to find out how **EACH individual Brother** was involved with his parish, how much help we, the Knights were offering the Parish Priest and how visible we were in our parish and our community. Remember the motto 'ACTION IS THE ENGINE OF THE COUNCIL.' In spite of the ease of returning this questionnaire, only 28 out of around 80 in Province have so far completed this 5-minute job. That means that I have more emails and phone calls to make **AGAIN**.

Also since the last issue of Roundabout, the first in a series of three **SEMINARS** was delivered using ZOOM. Apart from the work in putting together the PowerPoint presentation, the hardest aspect of the whole exercise, was trying to get Grand Knights and Deputy Grand Knights to commit to Zooming-in to attend the Seminar. In the end we did do quite well and 18 brothers participated, which is in my view a great success. Unfortunately on the night, the gremlins were out but with the help of Bro Ade and Bro Rosario, we managed to rescue the day. The Seminar was very well received and thanks to everyone who came on line, including the Supreme Knight.

Covid-19 is not all bad news. Through Zoom we are able to get invites to Council meetings and we can have Seminars and communicate with all the councils without actually leaving home. The next Seminar will address two of the four main KEY OFFICES of each council. In the next month, I and Province will address the issues of ACTION & YOUTH together with MEMBERSHIP & DEVELOPMENT, and another Seminar will be prepared to meet with all the Council officers holding these positions, as well as their Grand Knight if he wishes and any other brother who may want to come forward, by means of learning what's required when nominations to fill these offices for 2021/2022 are made.

I thank all brothers who helped me in many ways to get these initiatives off the ground, and we hope that in the long run, we will be able to see improvements which will help us in our work as Knights of St Columba in the community. ®
