

Lost a Battle but not the War....

The second reading vote may well have gone against the wish of many in the country. For who watched the debate on the BBC Parliament channel it was easy to take in how strong and emotional the arguments were, for and against Bill. However, although the bill was passed, was only the second reading, and it will now the House of Lords and will eventually for the third and final reading where it could well be a completely different story when the vote is taken.



I understand from an MP who was in the House on the day, that often members vote one FOR the bill just to enable it to go the full process, ie, it will encourage further debate, in both houses, and when it comes back for the final reading, after it may well be amended in committee, it will then fail the final hurdle and will not pass into law. A number of MPs actually stated this kind of manoeuvre when they stood up to speak. One needs to remember there were 46 did not vote or abstained so the vote may well be different in the final stage.

Statement about the Assisted Suicide Bill

Following the decision of MPs to vote in favour of the Terminally III Adults (End of Life) Bill at the Second Reading on 29th November, Bishop John Sherrington, Lead Bishop for Life Issues, said: "We are disappointed that MPs have voted in favour of the Terminally III Adults (End of Life) Bill progressing through parliament.

We believe that this bill is flawed in principle and also contains particular clauses that are of concern. We ask the Catholic community to pray that members of parliament will have the wisdom to reject this bill at a later stage in its progress. In addition to being opposed to the principle of assisted suicide, we are particularly concerned with clauses in the bill that prevent doctors from properly exercising conscientious objection, provide inadequate protection to hospices and care homes that do not wish to participate in assisted suicide and allow doctors to initiate conversations about assisted suicide.

We ask that these voices be heard in the next stages of the Bill to strengthen the deep concerns about this proposed legislation. We have expressed the view, during this debate, that genuine compassion involves walking with those who need care, especially during sickness, disability and old age. The vocation to care is at the heart of the lives of so many people who look after their loved ones and is the sign of a truly compassionate society. It is essential that we nurture and renew the innate call that many people have to compassionately care for others. It remains the case that improving the quality and availability of palliative care offers the best pathway to reducing suffering at the end of life. We will continue to advocate for this and support those who work tirelessly to care for the dying in our hospices, hospitals and care homes." **Unquote.** •



During the Assisted dying bill debate, the importance of palliative care the hospices provide was very evident. Hospices rely on fundraising to continue to exist.

Unfortunately due to the recent Employers' National Insurance Contribution TAX increases [NIC] Hospices are having to cut nursing staff to keep going.

I am very happy to learn about all the different councils that are fundraising for a Hospice, in our Province. Co422 High Wycombe, who already contributed over £1150 to the current Provincial Project, North London Hospice, on November28th, they presented a similar cheque for £1150 to South Bucks Hospice. I am overly proud of High Wycombe, because they only have THREE active brothers plus a number of other housebound members too, but in

spite of this they are so well connected with at least two different Parishes, they regularly organise an annual Sponsored Walk, the proceeds of which is then split between their own project and the Provincial Project. South Bucks Hospice is a day hospice that supports patients living with threatening illnesses by providing specialist palliative care on an outpatient basis. They help people at any stage of their diagnosis adjust mentally, physically, psychologically, socially, and emotionally to their condition, stay well, and cope with any health and care needs at home, wherever possible.

A bit of background — Council 422 is one of the councils of Province 23 where I was a PGK several years ago.... Council 422



as well as Co514 Ascot - later to become Co984 moved over to Province 30 bringing with them a very healthy fundraising streak, and also the George Marriott Fund. £10000 was raised for Thames Hospice two years ago. My hope is that all our councils could strive to emulate this background. Number of brothers in council is not what counts here, but how well connected with the local community is so important, together with a drive to help those less fortunate than ourselves is what matters. Well Done High Wycombe, keep it up.


