Brothers, Rev. Fathers, Widows, family and friends, I am happy to be sending you this bi-monthly copy of our Province 41 Newsletter. There has been so much going on in our province that we are happy to be sharing with you.

This Province is the first of the newly amalgamated provinces that has started off with a Provincial Council meeting on 16th of March. It is time to put Covid19 behind us and start the recovery by looking around at the damage Covid has done to the Order. It has been very difficult to replace some brothers who have since passed away, it has been hard to keep the councils going, especially those who did not find a way of continuing their

monthly meetings. It has highlighted the importance of regular meetings, because that's the time/place where every council reviewed how they had done, and plan what they will be doing, going forward. The fallout of all this is that some councils found it difficult to continue practicing in their old way, and some could not even elect a council team, ending up by transferring to nearby councils to keep going, while others decided they could not continue and unfortunately our numbers shrunk a little. The number of active councils is now down to around twenty four, with some four more who's future is in the balance.

I am happy to welcome Rev Fr Phillip Baptise as our new Provincial chaplain - and look forward to him attending our Provincial meetings when they are scheduled face to face or on line. Our chaplain opens the meeting with an extract from Holy Scripture and follows this be a short reflection which many brothers look forward to.

On the positive side however, we are now ready to start recruiting and becoming more and more active in our parishes and schools. The effect has been felt in parishes as well as in organisations same as ours. Province 41 acknowledges that we have to keep up with the times, and a lot of our work will now be done online. Its not that frightening, but it does need one to adopt a 'can-do attitude' and start using some of the technology that surrounds everyone these days. Some brothers prefer to meet up at the home of a closeup brother who is on Wifi.

We have a new Provincial Project— THE NORTH LONDON HOSPICE for which we hope that working together in all our councils, we can raise a record amount of money by March 2025. It is difficult to recognise how much they do, unless one had the unfortunate experience to be referred to them by his/her oncologist, as it happens when NHS could do nothing more for them. It is really hard for suffering patients to accept that becoming a palliative care patient, does mean it's the end of life. They do this with dedication and for free. They do not charge one penny for their time, travel, services, equipment and everything else they offer, but they survive on donations and help from fundraisers. So I am asking all brothers, their councils, their families and friends to chip in and be generous with their support to our fundraising between now and the end of February 2025 - when I hope we can raise at least £15,000 for this hospice, while at the same time look around for a new annual project for 2025/2026.

Not unlike other provinces in the knights, many of our members are getting on in life, some are even housebound or in a care home, or at times dedicating all their time to caring after their wives. One of the key objective for our council this year should be to make sure these brothers are not forgotten. Some Councils already visit and keep in touch, but this year we should go a step further by sending absent brothers the monthly council minutes, make sure they get a copy of the Roundabout and any other communication material available. Many would have given our Order and our Councils a lot of their time and effort in the past and its sad, if just because they cannot attend meetings, they tend to be forgotten. I will be reading the council minutes to find out how much debate takes place under the WELFARE side of our work, and hope we can celebrate a new approach.

All councils have by now elected their new council teams, completed their FA5 forms and installed their new council brothers. It is important for all councils to follow procedures by installing the council officers in their job, whether they are new to the office, or just standing for another year. It is ideal if the installation is done in church with the cooperation of your local Parish Priest, and in front of the local congregation where most of your work will be done in the coming months, hopefully succeeding in recruiting some new members. •





As agreed at the Provincial meeting - Province has now purchased a ZOOM licence. This was essential in view of the Provincial Meetings we plan to be having on line. It is also important because there will be a series of training seminars for Grand Knights and their Deputies, Finance and Administration, Welfare and Spirituality and also Membership...which is responsible for 'Development', a modern word for training.

Training is an important area in Prov41. Being mindful that most of the brothers holding office, have been in the Order for some years, the training is not really aimed at teaching them how to do their job, but more really aimed at refreshing minds about how things SHOULD be done according to the laid down procedures of the Order. Councils will be encouraged to adopt the same standard, i.e. the HOW one expects things to be done going forward, often sharing each others good practices.

At times I am quoted the constitution of the Order by some, which is all very correct, but often the rules are there to be bent as long as the bending does not mean breaking the rules. As the saying goes 'Rules are for fools and the guidance of wise men'.

Province 41 is now 'under new management' and I am sure one would understand that there will be changes in approach and administration. A new broom sweeps well, and over time the 'HOW' things are done has changed considerably, either because we as Knights have moved on, or because the rules have not really kept up with the times, or even because Covid19 has forced changes on us.

One cannot deny having heard 'WORKING FROM HOME' these days, and may even have family members doing just that. The Knights should be working from home, because most of our work is done between meetings, and working from home in the 21st century means Emails, Whatsp, computers, tablets, Iphones etc.

I am hoping that councils will also change to keep up with the times and adopt on-line facilities, monitor their emails at least twice daily, and be ready to attend meetings, training sessions and prayer groups online. I am not really worried about which system one uses - but I wish to urge councils and brothers to become more participating in what's going on - if the will is there everything is possible. We can use TEAMS - GOOGLE MEET - or ZOOM, but it will be really helpful if councils do try and utilise the new modern way of communicating with each other. I will be happy to set up Zoom meetings for any council who wish me to do so, and in doing so you can have the provincial team members 'sort-of' – visiting your on-line meetings as well. The district deputies cannot do it all, although there will be visiting to councils over the months. •



MEMBERSHIP & DEVELOPMENT is one of the most important areas of councils/provinces and it implies that there should be ongoing training of brothers in all areas relative to the post they hold. Last year Province 30 run a number of online training seminars aimed at the top five offices - the GKs and their Deputies - F & A - M & D - S & W and A & Y. The seminars last around one to one and half hours are being reviewed and updated and will be ready to be run again for both the Provincial and Council officers and will now also include a session for the District Deputies. I look forward to seeing as many brothers as possible attending the relevant seminars aimed at the official function they hold.

Each seminar will have optional dates for people to register and attend, and invitations will be sent out to all the brothers who are covered by the seminar subject. First seminar will be for Grand Knights and their Deputies. •

GEORGE MARRIOTT TRUST

The Provincial Council meeting on 16th of March debated and voted to adopt the George Marriott Fund featured in the last Roundabout - as The Trust of the new province 41.

For some of the councils who were not represented at the meeting, this means that ALL the councils in Province 41 will now make an annual donation to the Trust, to help in maintaining the funding level healthy enough to be able to meet requests for help from Seminarians or Clergy in their studies and ministry.


Briefly I will explain the basics of the Trust. Each and every council will make a donation to the Trust. It has been customary that an annual donation of £50 per council would be welcome, but over the months some councils found it difficult to keep up that level of donation. When a council is in financial difficulties and cannot afford the full £50 it will be understandable if they forward a lesser amount until their General Fund could afford more, but hopefully smaller and poorer councils can find £25 possible, especially if their council operates a ringfenced 'Charity' fund. In an extreme case where no donation was possible, councils may wish to contact the Provincial F &A officer by email, explain and be granted a 'holiday-year' until their finances improved. During that period, that council could not submit a donation request for a seminarian/clergy.



The Trust have made of a Donation of £500 to a seminarian studying at Allen Hall in answer to his letter asking for help which was relayed down to us from Head Office. (See his 'Thank you note'). All council donations for the current year should

be sent to Bro Des O'Reilly our Prov F&A either by cheque or bank transfer (Knights of St Columba Westminster P41 Acct # 01817622 Sort Code 30-92-82) with ref of 'George Marriott'.

May I suggest that each council adds the George Marriott Trust to its agenda in the next month to ensure that the matter of how much your council can afford be debated and agreed upon earlier in the year, and so enable your finance officer to forward the money to Province and avoid reminds as the months go on. Thank you.



NORTH LONDON HOSPICE

PROVINCIAL PROJECT April 2024 - April 2025



There are some who don't *know what's going on, some* that cannot understand what needs to be done and some that do something. That's a saying that has some value, but for the best of the three, just doing something is not enough.

What is needed is... 'to do the work', stop and examine how well you'd done it and try to improve on it next time...' as in business ...by carrying out a washup, a review. Unless one does this, the next time one did the same thing without having identified the earlier shortcomings, one will keep repeating one's mistakes or even worse add to them.

I'm not sure if Province 11 and 29 did run a Provincial Project in their time, but Province 30 have done this for several years, as can be seen on the new provincial website [www.province41.co.uk under provincial projects]. Two events that are very popular in the Knights are Walks and Retreats. Sometimes we come away after the event moaning that there were not enough walkers, or the expected turnup did not happen. Yet we plan the same events again the following year. Nobody can fault the organizers for trying, but there is no point in repeating an event if it does not prove to be popular, except when in an other councils, it could well be the most successful fundraiser.

I believe in organizing action events that are going to attract attention, pull in people, and produce results. My motto is ... *Minimum effort for Maximum gain*.

Walks as an action project are normally a good idea, but the objective is raising lots of money for the cause. One will only need a handful of walkers, but they need to be popular enough to attract sponsorship. From the 'washup review' it became obvious when one asked "Who is the most popular person in the parish?" The parish priest! So get him to walk and to invite the congregation to walk with him. People will be falling over themselves to sign on for £5, £10 or even £20 each. Standing outside the church on Sunday morning asking the people if they wanted to sponsor their PARISH PRIEST? Of course they would. They do it because they may like the priest, or maybe they don't want him to find out they had not supported his effort. If the priest has a parish-popular charity, e.g. an orphanage, or an invalid young person who one may wish to support, going to Lourdes, or maybe the priest champions a local hospice, then sponsorship will grow exponentially.

Council 261 Palmers Green who promoted and won this year's Provincial Project, will be looking out for all our councils to be fundraising, partly because its their project, but also because fundraising for a HOSPICE project, wherever that may be, is so popular these days when everyone knows someone who is close to the end-of-life, or have lost someone to Cancer or Dementia. Compassion is not really going to achieve much, but helping a hospice to provide the premises where they do the caring, (and they do it for free remember!!), is one of the kindest thing one can do for those who are terminally ill.


Trying to shame the councils for not supporting the event, doesn't make you any friends either, so brothers lets not even think about doing so. EVERY council should be already debating, planning and putting in place what they intend to do to support the Provincial Project. The Provincial Action Convenor, Bro John Lynn, will be asking councils to debate how the fundraising is going, at <u>each council meeting</u>, and to be able to show in their minutes, how much their council had raised so far each month.

Please do not leave it till the end of the year to start fundraising. The Provincial Project will end in February 2025 and by then, it is hoped that the 24+ councils can easily raise £15000.

IN REMEMBERANCE

In remembrance - On 2nd April Province 41 officers our Regional Director and PSK Bro Bertie Grogan attended the funeral of Mary Catherine Brennan at Our Lady Queen of Apostles church at The Green in Heston. Mary was the widow of Bro Tony Brennan member Province 30 and also for a number of years served as a member Board of Directors of the Order. In 2007 Bro Tony Brennan put together a training document covering all the duties of Council and Provincial officers - which is still in use to this day. It provides a good



reference for brothers who wish to stand for office but are not sure what-to-do. •



At the Provincial Council meeting we asked brothers if they wished that the ex Province 30 100-club be adopted as the Province 41 club, and all those present put their hand up.

It will be Bro Desmond O'Reilly's job of running the club, and the first thing he needs from all the councils, their brothers, their friends and families etc to buy a subscription of £1 per month paid annually, which means that the council gets together and make a list of the brothers wanting to participate and to send Bro Des a list of names and subscriptions. Bro Des will keep a list of names and allocates a number against each name, he will draw two names up each month - 1st name will win £50 and 2nd name will win £25. The first draw will be made at the end of May and thereafter each month until the end of March 2025. SO PLEASE BROTHERS.... Get your names in as soon as possible. Because this first year, the club will only have run 11months, there will be a double draw at Christmas 2 x £50 and 2 x £25. if the venture is popular enough to continue.

The club was set up by Bro Jim Keating [RIP] to help raise money for the Provincial



General account. So its easy to see that unless the venture does not attract enough subscribers to at least cover the prizes, it will not run, and the brothers will be refunded their money.





ITS that time of the year again!

No brother can claim of never having heard the words LEVY or DUES, and unfortunately that time comes round every year..... Its happens in April, but it is not April's fool, its real and its here again. The main reason given by the Board of Directors at the last Supreme Council, for being overspent on the annual budget set for the Order, was that brothers were not paying their annual membership fee, and even worse, some councils had not paid their invoice.

The main income of the Order is the membership fees that brothers pay each year, so if we really value our Order and wish it well, we need to be paying our membership fees, to the council Finance and Admin officers by the end of June. This province will not be spending too much time after June trying to convince brothers in arrears to do their duty. The constitution lays down the process that must be taken, and Province 41 will follow the rules. •


